

# Notice of Public Hearing on Tax Increase

The Wilson County Memorial Hospital District will hold two public hearings on a proposal to increase total tax revenues from properties on the tax roll in the preceding tax year by 7.55 percent (percentage by which proposed tax rate exceeds lower of rollback tax rate or effective tax rate calculated under Tax Code Chapter 26). Your individual taxes may increase at a greater or lesser rate, or even decrease, depending on the change in the taxable value of your property in relation to the change in taxable value of all other property and the tax rate that is adopted.

The first public hearing will be held on September 13, 2017 / 6:00 pm at Connally Memorial Medical Center, Conf Room.

The second public hearing will be held on September 18, 2017 / 6:00 pm at Connally Memorial Medical Center, Conf Room.

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in Wilson County last year was \$ 164,620.00

Based on last year's tax rate of \$ 0.1129 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed last year on the average home was \$ 185.86

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in Wilson County this year is \$ 173,126.00

\_\_\_\_\_ If the governing body adopts the effective tax rate for this year of \$ 0.1113 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$ 192.69

If the governing body adopts the proposed tax rate of \$ 0.1197 per \$100 of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be \$ 207.23

Members of the public are encouraged to attend the hearings and express their views.

## Special Provision\*

### Enhanced Indigent Health Care Expenditures:

The Wilson County Memorial Hospital spent \$ 1,496,586.00 from July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 on enhanced indigent health care at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is 0.00.
